hotel belvedere



Dominating Mykonos's whitewashed houses, fabled windmills and the peerless Aegean, the Hotel Belvedere was inspired by the pristine simplicity of a Cycladic village.

Built in 1995 around a 19th century mansion, its loggias and balconies, landscaped swimming-pool and lush palm-fronded gardens provide a setting of calm, beauty and opulence only three minutes from town. Renovations in 2002 by interior architect Agelos Agelopoulous fuse the contemporary and the classical, blending marble, wood, steel, stone and sailcloth to rival the architectural restraint of Doric antiquity. Spread among six villas, each tasteful room's furnishing is unique but themes of white and grey predominate, creating a play of light and shadow with the passing hours.

A flowered atrium houses the only Matsuhsia restaurant (by Nobu) in Greece. Summer guests may savour inventive nouvelle cuisine by world-renowned chef Nobu Matsuhsia who applies Peruvian flair to traditional Japanese fare. The Remyie wine cellar boasts some 5000 bottles, a wine library, and presentations by local vintners.

Whether one leans toward lively nightlife or the peaceful contemplation of a spectacular sunset - or both! - the Belvedere is a theatre of contrasts on an island of contrasts, where celebrities mingle with classical scholars heading sirens from the heroic past.
